Mr. James Shultz of Box 190, Shipman, Illinois has recovered from a sudden illness.

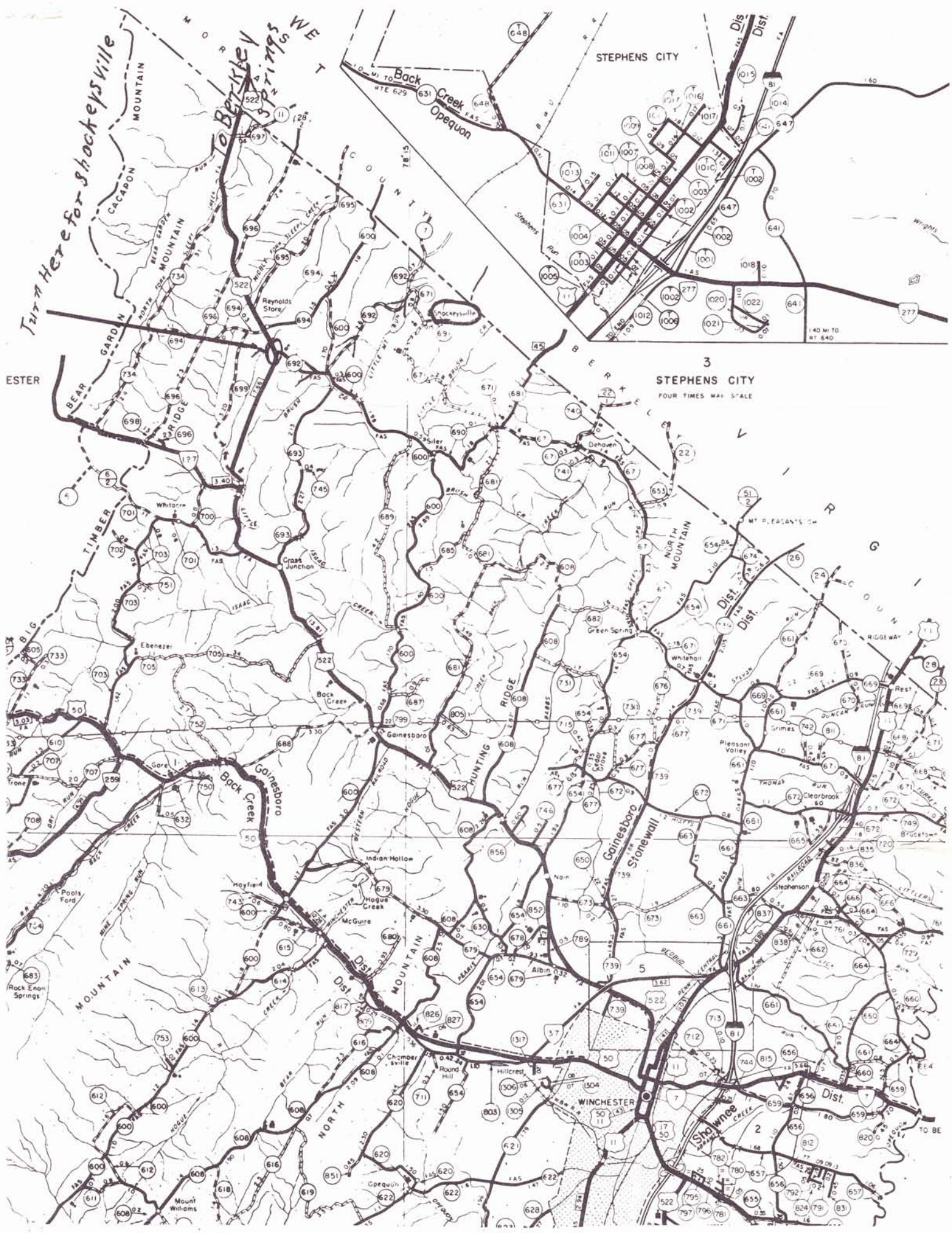
Mrs James Shultz (Roberta), is home from the hospital recovering from a serious illness.
