## Drexel's Founder Named Exporter of Year

**R**OBERT D. SHOCKEY, WHO 12 years ago sunk his life savings to establish Drexel Chemical Co. with headquarters in his home, is this year's "Exporter of the Year."

The award was presented Friday at the December meeting of the Mid-South Exporters' Roundtable.

Shockey, 51, a native of Wolfe County, Ky., had his eye on foreign markets early on and established an international subsidiary at the time he formed Drexel.

Today Drexel competes with multi-national firms in the sale of herbicides, pesticides and fungicides. In spite of the dollar's sharp increase in value against other currencies, Drexel is reporting a 20% increase in export sales this year.

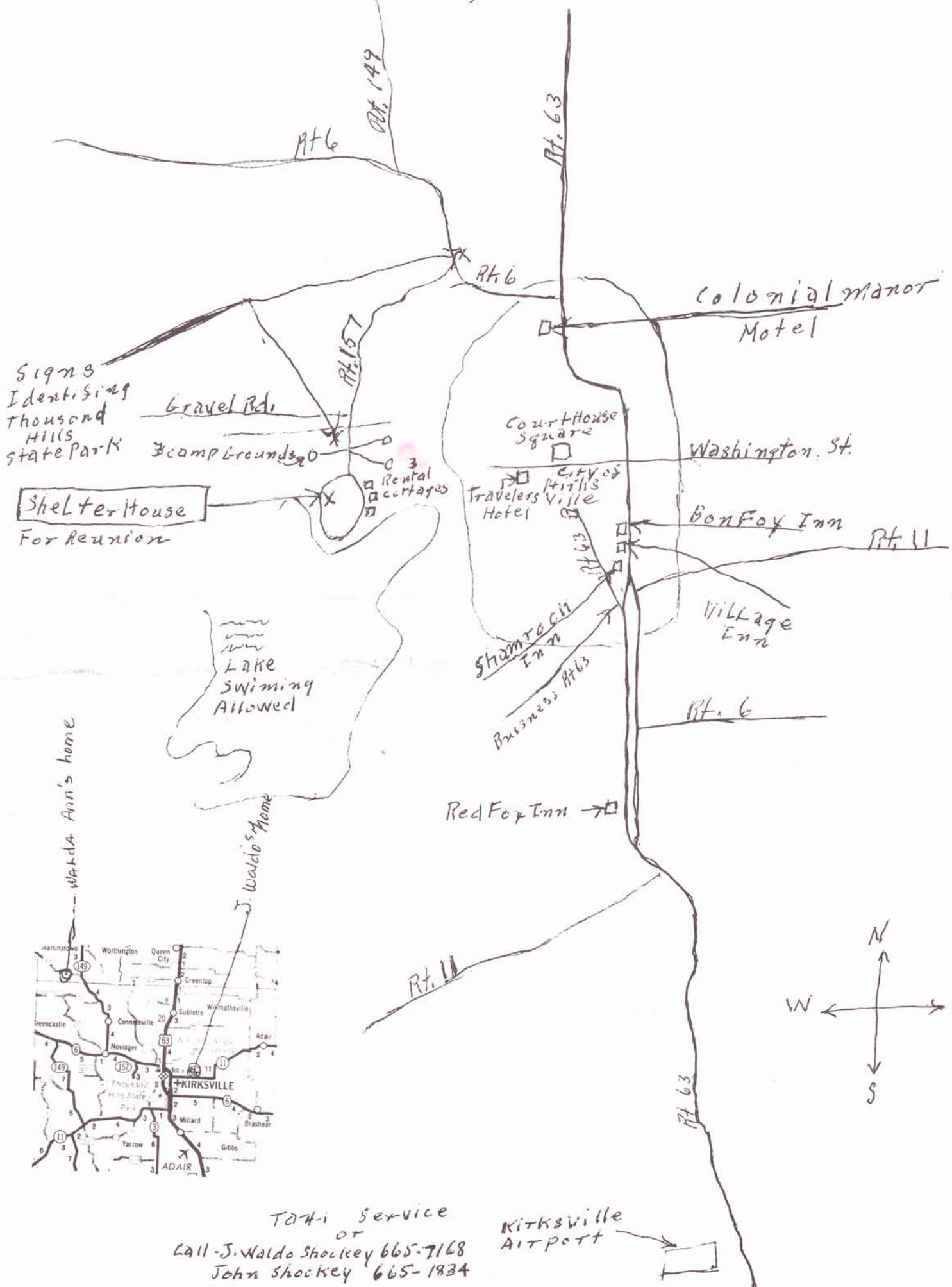
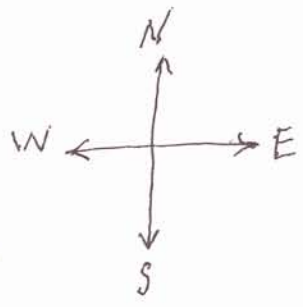
