Dear Friends and Shockey "Cousins",

Here it is, 15 February, and I am just getting started on the newsletter. I have been so snowed in that I couldn't get out to make the necessary arrangements. Some are still not complete. I am usually "nudging" Les and David to get their part done and mailed to me. Les is way ahead of me this time and David getting his done before I need it. It will all come together in the long run. It always does.

Thank you all for all of your letters, cards and phone calls. It is so nice to hear from you. Thank you for the articles you submit for the newsletter and the financial support that keeps it going. It is your newsletter, continue to be a part of it.

The 2004 Reunion will be held in Winchester/Shockeysville, Virginia, July 1st through 5th. I have reserved 30 rooms at the **Red Roof Inn in Winchester, Virginia** at the intersection of I-81 and Rt. 50. There are 24 double bed rooms in non-smoking, 2 double bed rooms in smoking and 4 king size bed rooms in non-smoking. The cost is \$52.64 plus tax. The phone number is **540-667-5000** and the **confirmation number is 6300062394**. This is the number you need to provide when calling to reserve a room in this block. Make your reservations early. If all rooms are not reserved by 18 June, they will be released to regular guests. After that, you would probably be charged the regular price instead of the Group Rate. I think they are all on the first floor. If you need a handicap room, please specify. The conference room will be at our disposal Thursday through Sunday. If any of you plan to arrive earlier or remain after the 4th, make sure they know that when you make your reservations. A nice Continental Breakfast is included. There are lots of good Restaurants nearby in most any price range and if you forgot to pack everything you need, there is a shopping center and several other shops including Wall Mart.

I will be at the Motel on Thursday, 1 July, early in the afternoon. The conference room will be available and the "Computer Guys" can get their equipment set up.

I plan to include a Bus Tour on Friday, but have not finalized that yet. Details will be in another part of the newsletter. I have to have 32 people in order to do a trip and their **reservations and checks must be in before 15 May**. I will not cash the checks until the 15th of May and if for any reason, I have to cancel the trip, I will refund your money right after that date.. I try to plan a trip with a minimum of walking so everyone can enjoy it. Pack your Reunion T-Shirt and cap and comfortable shoes and we'll be good to go.

On Saturday we will take you on the Oakland/Shockeysville tour. Sandwiches and beverages will be provided by the church ladies at noon. (Donations to the Church are suggested). Anyone who does not want to take that tour can spend the day shopping or exploring the area. There is lots to see within an hour drive; Civil War Battlefields, Patsy Cline's grave, Harpers Ferry, antique shops or just our picturesque scenery.

On Sunday we attend services at Shockeyville Church at 8:45 a.m. After services, there is time to pay dues, purchase a T-shirt if you don't have one, take pictures and visit with each other until noon when we will have a catered lunch. Details of that are elsewhere in the newsletter. After lunch, we have our General Meeting and decide where next year's reunion will be and maybe have some Gospel Music by Rev. Isaac Luttrell and Diane.

On Monday, we will offer the guided tour of the Maryland/Pennsylvania area where the Shockeys lived and made history. The tour will leave the motel at 10:00 a.m., "Caravan Style". There are usually about 10 to 15 cars. Howard Shockey will conduct the tour and John may go along to make sure he does it right. Those who have done this tour many times may decide to head for home. This tour is very interesting and historic, especially for those who are descended from the Shockeys who remained in Pennsylvania. I would recommend that all of you should experience this tour at least one time.

Last year David and Donna Shockey hosted the reunion in Salt Lake City, Utah. David didn't get to take much of a part in anything. He got really sick and spent one night in the hospital. I was glad I had gotten there a couple of days early to help Donna. She really did a super-good job. It is a wonderful area to visit. There is so much to do and so much to see. I think all of our guests got to do some sight-seeing and researching and some of them got in a little shopping. We had several new 'cousins' to get acquainted with, and three of them volunteered to serve on the Board of Directors. I think everyone signed in who was there, but some left the zip code off of their address. I need that for your newsletters.

We did not have a large attendance, but it was a very successful reunion. Twelve states were represented, we met several new cousins and some who had only attended once or twice, were able to attend again. Thanks again to David and Donna, but a special thank-you to Donna for all she did to make it a wonderful reunion.

I am including the coupon page again for your convenience in paying dues and making address corrections or additions. When paying dues, it would help if you add your membership number if you have one.

This Newsletter depends on your continued financial support. It is expensive to do, but I feel that it is worth all the time and money that it takes. Last year the total cost was \$3,008.12. The bulk mail permit was \$150.00, printing 1800 newsletters, \$2,098.80, mailing labels, \$58.45, mailing 1627 newsletters @ bulk rate, 1 to Germany and 15 to Canada, \$583.14; mail some extra, \$9.76, returns not deliverable, \$107.97. Total direct donations to me were \$2,583.00. The balance due was \$425.12 which was paid to me by our treasurer. As you may note, the donations almost covered the cost. The last couple of years we have had one very generous donor. There is no way that I can thank him enough. He has been a real blessing to us.

The arrival of the newsletter is eagerly awaited by many and some get anxious and begin calling just to make sure they are still on the mailing list. We include all of the genealogical information that is sent in and encourage folks to send in any articles of interest that they think someone else might enjoy. This is really the only link some of these folks have with Shockey's other than their immediate family.

Please send address changes when you move or the Post Office decides to give you a new address just to complicate things. They will not forward bulk mail, so you may get lost forever. It presently costs .77 cents for every newsletter returned for an address correction. Sometimes I get your new address and sometimes it is just stamped "moved, left no forwarding address", "attempted, unknown" or "not deliverable as addressed". I get several new addresses every year, but I lose more than I gain.

We sell Reunion T-shirts and caps and often have a raffle to raise money, but it doesn't even begin to make a dent. We have very few other expenses since most of what we do is a labor of love. All of the work and research that Les and Bud and Gerald do takes a lot of their time and it is not cheap. I have been doing the newsletter for 30 years and I only ask to be reimbursed for the cost of printing and mailing. When Ralph was alive and we both had an income, we covered all of the cost. I don't know how he ever got me to promise to keep doing the newsletter and hosting reunions. You can't imagine the amount of time we spend helping folks with their research, but when we find a new cousin, it is well worth the effort that we have put forth. Last week I had a letter from a lady in New York. Someone in California had told her about the newsletter. I checked the information she gave me and I can trace her all the way back to John Christopher Shockey through his son, Christian. She will get all of her genealogy done without all of the hard work. This is what we do and the newsletter plays an important part. I am including a list of the Officers and Directors of the Shockey Family Memorial Fellowship. Feel free to contact us at any time. If one of us can't answer your question, we will refer you to one who can. A copy of the minutes of the General Meeting is included. The names of the three people who volunteered to be considered to serve on the board of directors are listed there.

Scott Luttrell did not give me a report on the church, but I do know that our bills are paid and everything is in good repair.

4. Motion was made and approved for the same board members as mentioned above, to continue for the next year.

5. Donna Shockey read the minutes of the 2002 General Meeting, which were approved as read.

6. John D. Shockey presented the Treasurer's Report. A copy of the report is attached. The beginning balance as of July 1, 2002 was \$1,547.89 and the ending balance as of June 30, 2003 is \$2,113.31. He mentioned that it was helpful to have the coupon in the Newsletter for folks to send in their membership dues. Motion was moved and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report.

7. Marie Shockey presented the Newsletter Report. A copy of the report is attached. Total expenses for the past year were \$3,008.12. Total direct donations were \$2,583.00. Motion was made and approved to reimburse Marie her expenses of \$425.12.

8. Lesley Shockey mentioned he is adding more people to the data base all the time. Did not get the red books to the point of being put on a CD. The mail list on Roots Web is staying about the same number.

Will continue adding to the data base. Currently trying to input into the data base all the Shockeyes born over 100 years ago.

9. Bud Roseberry and Gerald Shockey mentioned the computer information had been covered.

10. Marie Shockey presented the Shockeyville United Methodist Church Report in Scott Luttrell's absence. All projects scheduled for the past year have been completed. The chain link fence is due to be installed around the cemetery to keep four wheelers from riding through the cemetery. The church is in good shape financially. They made \$4,000 in three hours at the annual outdoor cookout.

11. OLD BUSINESS:

The question was raised about the replacement for Francis Shockey (State Representative), who resigned in 2002. Daniel Shockey had agreed to fill in - the State Representative must live in Virginia.

We will need to have a replacement for Francis Shockey and Nora Seitz. No one has heard from Walda Ann Shockey (Director/Missouri) in over 4 years and do not know what her status is.

Motion was moved, seconded and approved that these bills be paid.



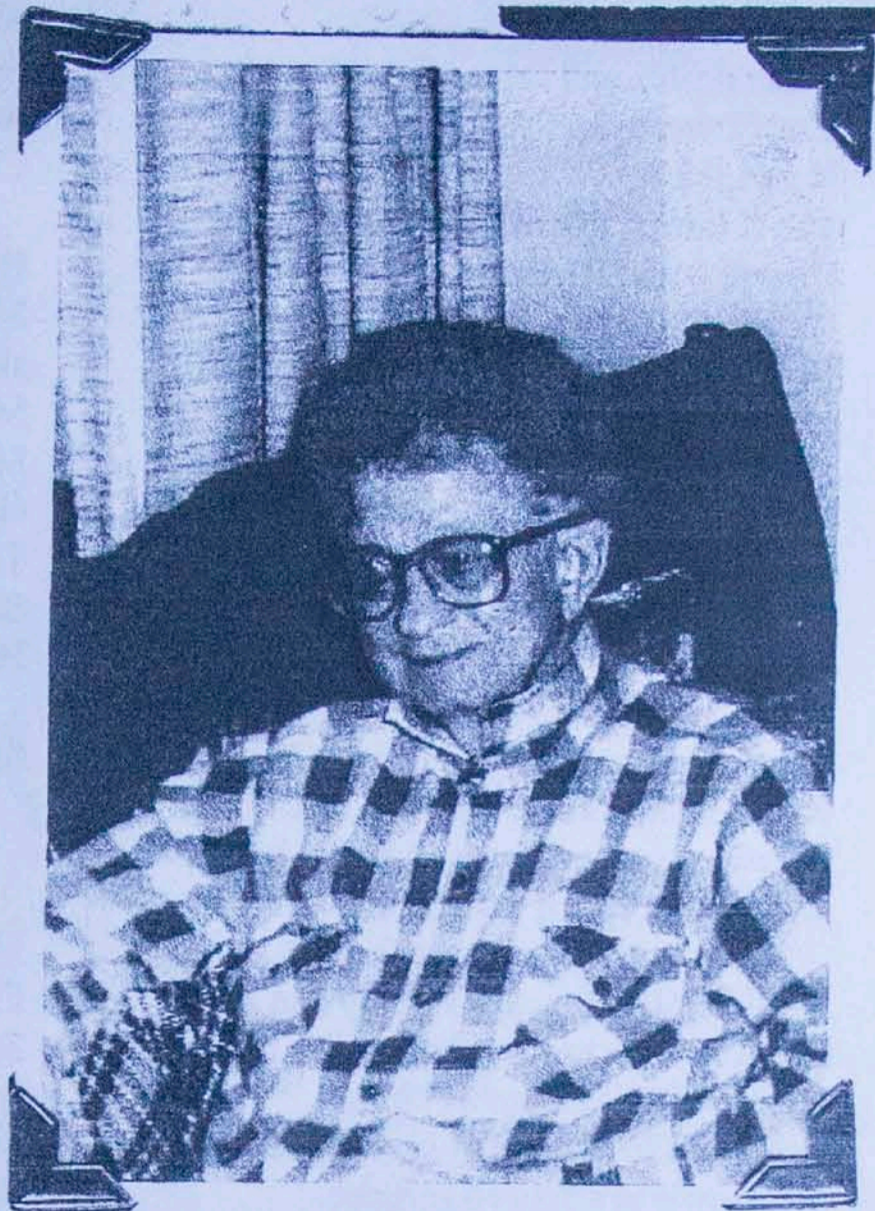

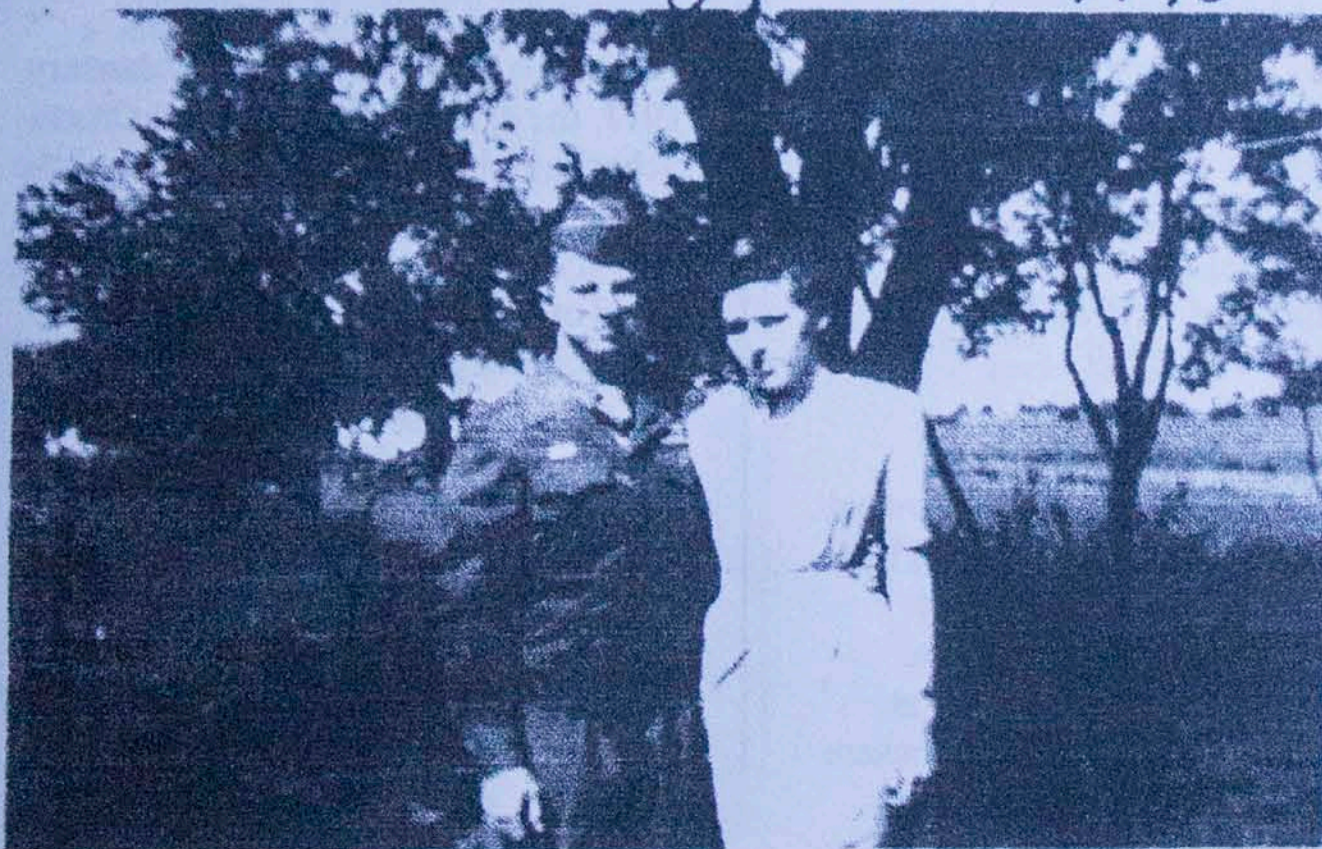

HERE'S WHAT REMAINS OF THE OLD OAKLAND POST OFFICE, which opened on January 4, 1833 and closed 50 years ago this week on October 31, 1953. The Oakland facility was the second postal installation in Morgan County, and was predated only by the Berkeley Springs Post Office. Part of the building and porch of the old store and post office have since been torn down. The first postmaster was George Aulabaugh and the last was Elizabeth Stotler. After the facility closed, the Oakland area was served for a time by the Stotlers Crossroads Post Office. Now, the only remaining post offices in the county are located in Berkeley Springs, Great Cacapon and Paw Paw. Part of eastern Morgan County is served by the Hedgenville Post Office.

Witness: Because his brain was sitting on my desk in a jar.

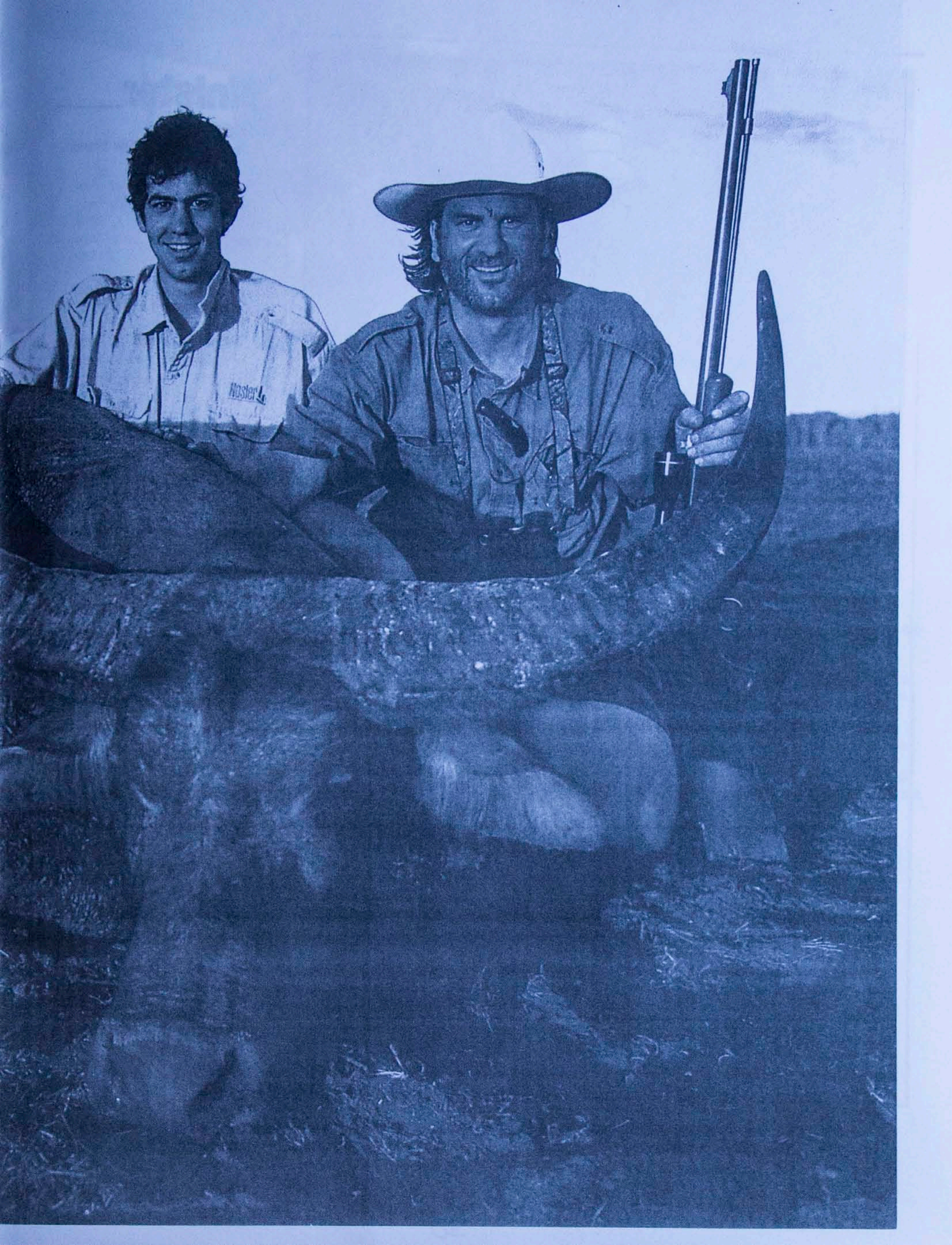

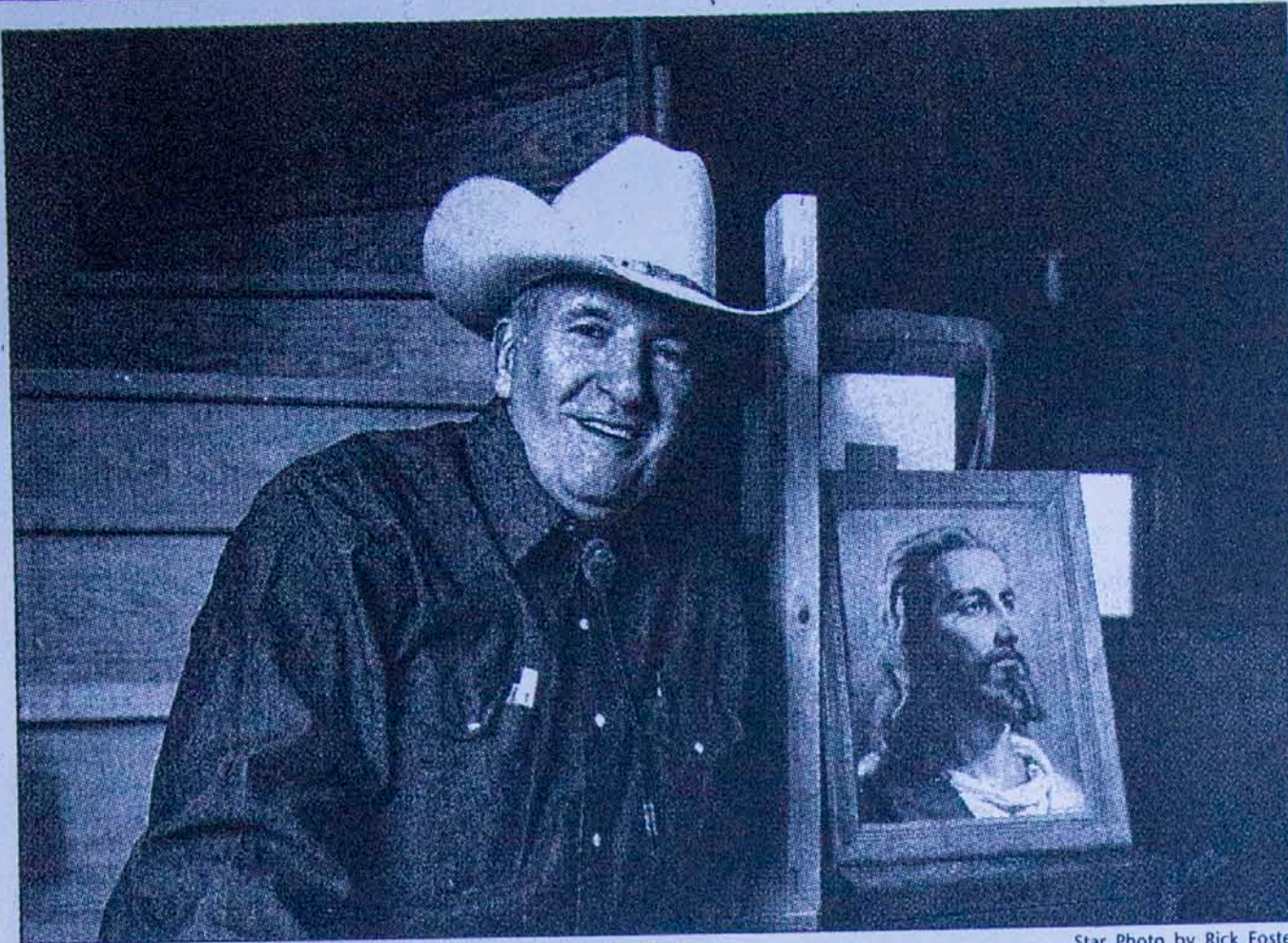

'A Talented Guy'

Energetic Minister Finds Plenty of Ways To Keep Busy on His Born Again Ranch

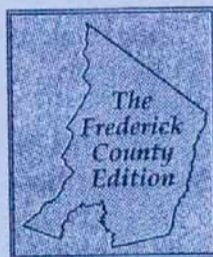
The Rev. Isaac Luttrell is a complex man. His wife, Diane, says so. Isaac sometimes agrees.

The 70-year-old said he was called by God to preach, and for 18 years has comfortably filled the pulpit at a three-church United Methodist charge in a rural section of northwest Frederick County.

Isaac is just as comfortable playing with and teaching his dogs to do tricks as he is operating heavy equipment, accumulating food for the food bank he's started, or building the couple's new house dug into the western slope of Great North Mountain near Gore.

So Isaac is a little bit of everything, Diane said.

"There's a part of him that's a little kid, like when he gets excited over seeing a



praying mantis," Diane said. "And he's the John Wayne type, the true grit, when he's moving dirt and building our house.

"And I'm overwhelmed, when I see him ministering and see all the divine authority he has. It's obvi-

ous he's a man God has called. He's such a talented guy."

Isaac, on the other hand, thinks of himself a simple man, down-to-earth, and at home in the pulpit.

"I can do a lot of things, and I don't get nervous preaching because I know God called me to do that," Isaac said, as he sat in the unfinished living room of the couple's new home and looked out at the forest surrounding the house.

Finding his way to the pulpit wasn't a

quick or easy trip.

Isaac stumbled a few times.

Although the smell of alcohol wasn't on his breath on Sunday morning Feb. 1, 1970, when Isaac walked into Hayfield Assembly of God Church on U.S. 50 West, it would have been there had he come to church the night before.

"I was consuming a case of beer a day, every day, as well as a lot of corn liquor and rye," Isaac said. "I drank beer instead of water."

Before Isaac left church that day, he said he had received Christ as his savior and was "delivered from alcohol. I didn't go through withdrawals or anything, and I haven't drunk a drop since."

Two years later, Isaac was sure he was being called to the ministry.

"But I needed education," said Isaac, a Navy veteran who then had just an 11th-grade education.

Isaac began taking classes at Valley Forge Christian College Extension, an Assembly of God college in Arlington.

"I had been going to college about two months when I took my GED test in Front Royal and passed," Isaac said.

By the summer of 1982, Isaac was an ordained minister and was pastor at an Assembly of God church in Osage, W.Va., on Interstate 79, northwest of Morgantown.

He had also helped organize a church school there.

Isaac left the church in Osage later that year, and nothing opened up for him in ministry for two years.

"Then the Lord started calling me to be a Methodist pastor, but I argued with the Lord, because I didn't want to be a circuit-riding preacher and go from church to church," he said.



Isaac stopped resisting in 1986 and accepted a call to Shockeyville, Howard's Chapel, and Pine Grove United Methodist Churches.

"I'm still with the same charge, although Pine Grove has gone with another charge and Chestnut Grove has been added to mine," said Isaac, who preaches at Shockeyville on Sunday mornings at 8:45, Howard's Chapel at 10 a.m., and Chestnut Grove at 11:15 a.m.

"I travel about 50 miles on Sunday morning from home to the churches and to eat lunch and back home," Isaac said.

With help from his congregations, Isaac organized a food pantry, Born Again Ministries Food Pantry, eight years ago.

The food not only fills a trailer sitting on the 77 acres he owns, it has taken over the basement of the house he's building.

Isaac takes individual donations and buys food from a

man in Glen Gary, W.Va., who has a food ministry and sells to churches and food ministries.

Isaac gives food to a mission, the Congregational Community Action Project, the Henry & William Evans Home for Children, and the Salvation Army, all in Winchester.

Isaac also helps needy families and passes out food on Saturdays from a van he calls the "Jesus Loves You Bus," which he parks on South Kent Street in Winchester.

"I was a widow with no intentions of getting married again," Diane said. "But when I met Isaac, I felt marrying him was what God wanted me to do. I felt God's love-dust sprinkled over me."

Isaac proposed to Diane on Easter morning in 1994 at Howard's Chapel. The couple were married in May that year at Pine Grove United Methodist Church.

After the wedding, the Luttrells moved into a trailer on the property Isaac owns and calls Born Again Ranch.

"This place is in the spirit," Isaac said, "and is where God

wants us."

Isaac started building their large brick home, which he calls a cabin, seven years ago. Diane told him what she wanted in the house. He laid it out and engineered the construction.

"It's taken a long time to build because Isaac is full of energy and has so much going on that it's difficult for him to finish something quickly," Diane said.

Isaac believes they will be moved in by Easter. Diane's reasonable guess is November. "I think my first big meal here will be Thanksgiving dinner," she said.

Diane has also become a part of Isaac's ministry and the two have formed a bluegrass gospel band, Born Again Bluegrass, which also includes Obie O'Brien.

"Diane plays a fiddle, I play lead guitar, and Obie plays rhythm guitar," said Isaac, who learned to play guitar in the Navy.

Diane also makes hospital visits with Isaac and takes care of many of his phone calls. "We are spiritual soul-mates," Isaac said.

Whether sitting atop a piece of heavy equipment, working on the house, or looking at a praying mantis, Isaac's faith surrounds him.

"I don't have plans for retiring from pastoring. When I'm older, though, I might slow down a little bit," he said, pausing to answer the phone.

"Praise the Lord," he said into the receiver. "Born Again Ranch. Too Blessed to Be Stressed Here."

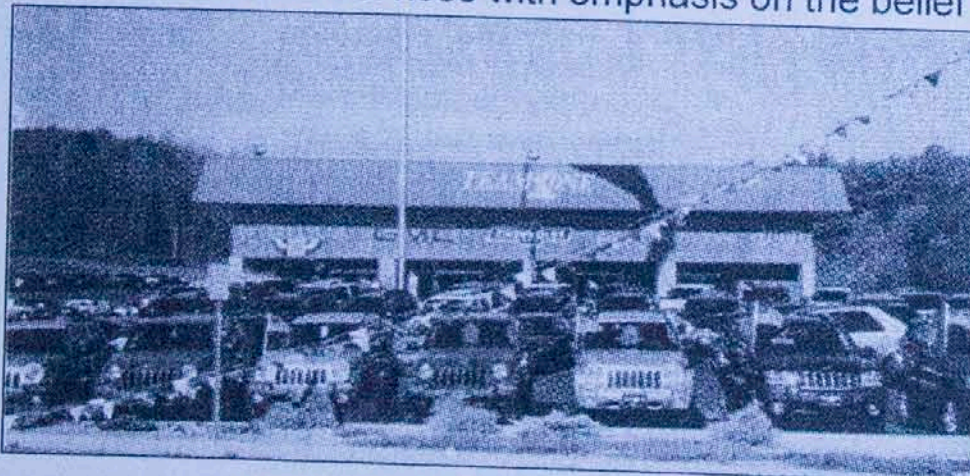

A number of people are looking for proof of Indians in our ancestry. It used to be considered something to be ashamed of or kept hidden. In those days you were either white or—what ever. I think that Indians couldn't even attend white schools and nobody wanted to be called a 'half-breed'. I don't think there is any doubt that some men married Indians when there was a shortage of women in this country. Ralph always suspected that when a man married and only the first name of his wife was recorded, most likely she was an Indian. We never found proof of that, but it sort of makes sense. It would certainly be interesting, but many such stories have been buried so long, they will never come to light.

I hope I haven't left out anything important. I have tried to cover everything and include every article that you all have sent in. If you have any questions, you can call or e-mail me. I hope to see many of you in July!!
