Dear Friends and Shockey Cousins,

Another year has gone and it has been very eventful---not all good. We have elected a new President, the economy is a total mess, there have been floods, fires, mud-slides, tornados, hurricanes and ice storms. Gas is cheaper; at least temporarily. The only thing we can do is look around and take notice of the many things we have to be thankful for.

Thank you all for the contributions toward the newsletter and for the cards, letters and phone calls during the past year. I received very few news items this year so keep that in mind and send me stories to share with everyone.

It is time to make plans for the 2009 Shockey Reunion. It will be held in Colorado Springs, Colorado on July 2nd through 5th. Most leave for home on Monday the 6th, but you can stay longer if you wish.

I have reserved rooms at the Hampton Inn Suites, 2910 Geyser Drive. A map will be included. The room rates are: 2 queen beds, \$107.10, 1 King, \$116.10 and King suites are \$125.10. David personally checked the motels in the area to find one that would meet our requirements. He gave me all of the information and I called them and asked all sorts of questions before I made a final decision. There was very little difference in the cost of any of them. They offer free continental breakfast, indoor pool, hot tub, a nice meeting room and free coffee in the breakfast area. We can have our Sunday lunch there, also. The number to call for reservations is: 1-719-884-0330 and be sure to specify Shockey Family Reunion. Reservations must be made by June 2nd.

I wanted to have the Sunday lunch catered, but I couldn't get it at a reasonable price so we have decided that we can do it ourselves for \$10.00 to \$12.00 per person. The motel will allow us to do this, none of the others would. I will need to know how many to plan for.

There are lots of wonderful things to do and see while we are there. The Flying W Ranch Dinner and Show seems to be the first choice with all that I have talked to, so I have made reservations for us on Saturday. They open at 3:00, dinner is at 5:00 or 5:30 and the show is over at 7:30. That gives us plenty of time to get back to the conference room to visit the rest of the evening. The cost is \$22.00 regular admission, \$20.00 for seniors and service personnel and \$12.00 for children under 12.

Another great attraction is The Garden of the Gods Visitor and Nature Center. They have free bus tours, free exhibits and a café and gift shops. Then there is the Money Museum, The Air Force Academy and the Manitou Cliff Dwellings. All sound real interesting to me. Most of these are about a 20 minute drive from the motel. Then there is Cripple Creek. That is a bit farther away, but you may want to visit there since it has some Shockey history. W. L. Shockey was a very prominent citizen. He owned the

drug store from 1896 to 1907 and was mayor in 1903. I think he came from Illinois. He had fifteen years of pharmaceutical experience in Pueblo, Colorado. I don't know where he went when he left Cripple Creek. He was quite a handsome gentleman.

I have left a lot of free time for you. The only things that I have scheduled is the Flying W Ranch on Saturday and lunch and General Meeting on Sunday about noon. The Officers and Directors do have to find time for a business meeting sometime Saturday. The rest of the time can be spent on genealogy or anything you want to do.

You don't need to pay ahead for the Flying W Ranch or Sunday lunch, but I do have to have a count. You can call me, write or e-mail me. Phone: 304-258-5616 or e-mail mshockeyl@earthlink.net My address is on the front of the newsletter. I am doing all of this by phone, so I need your cooperation. I have to know how many I have to have food for on Sunday and the Flying W Ranch has to know how many will be there for dinner.

If you plan to drive, there is a map included, if you fly, it is cheaper to fly to Denver, rent a car and drive to Colorado Springs. That is about an hour drive. I don't have information on RV Parks, but I would suggest that you reserve your space early.

The 2008 Reunion was held in Winchester and Shockeysville, Virginia. There were 43 attending; a small turn-out due mostly to gas prices. Some did have to cancel due to health problems at home. We had a really wonderful time as we had a good many folks who had never been here before. - 1. David F. Shockey opened the meeting and greeted everyone in attendance.
- 2. David L. Shockey led the opening prayer.
- 3. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by everyone. The group stood quietly for the ringing of Aunt Maggie's bell.
- 4. David L. Shockey read the memoriam for the Shockey cousins who had passed on during the year.
- 5. David F. Shockey introduced the board members who were present. The attendees also introduced themselves and told where they traveled from. Folks in attendance were from West Virginia, Virginia, Pennsylvania, Arkansas, Arizona, New York, Washington, Florida, Alaska, Ohio, and Kentucky.
- 6. Donna P. Shockey read the minutes of the 2007 General Meeting. Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the minutes as read.
- 7. <u>Treasury Report</u>. Marie F. Shockey presented the Treasury Report in the absence of the Treasurer. The ending balance as of June 30, 2008 was \$2,726.22 (copy attached). Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.
- 8. Newsletter Report. Marie F. Shockey presented the Newsletter Report (copy attached). 1500 newsletters were printed, 1217 newsletters plus 13 to Canada were mailed out, and 18 were mailed at the regular postal rate. 55 newsletters were returned. Total cost for the newsletters was \$2,884.92; donations received were \$1,507.50. The amount due to Marie for out of pocket expenses is \$1,404.92. Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Newsletter Report and to reimburse Marie \$1,404.92.

Marie reminded folks to send her any changes of addresses and to let her know if a newsletter needs to be stopped due to a death. She would also like to have names of those cousins who would like to receive the newsletter. Any newspaper articles or other information can be sent to Marie or Les as this is the main method of keeping up with relatives. All donations are greatly appreciated and are needed to continue with publishing and mailing out the newsletter.

9. Genealogy Report: Les Shockey said there were approximately 110 – 120 members on the e-mail group. Over 900 new family members were added to the data base this past year and he received several photographs and corrections to names. The data base continues to grow; however, it is not yet on-line. One reason is that there were policy changes on the Roots Web account. He was not comfortable uploading information on to the data base if it did not provide the security of being removed and sold by others for a profit. He has moved all his genealogy off the Roots Web.

The Shockey DNA project is now in the works. Ten people ordered the test. Two of the tests are totally complete, two others were not in the Shockey DNA, five are still in the process of being tested, and one DNA seems to be standard for all of them. He hopes to get at least two descendents from each of the sons (Abraham, John, Christopher, Valentine, Isaac) and also from Samuel Christian by his second wife To receive the best DNA testing, one should have the 67 marker test done (\$269.00 + shipping). Les will be glad to answer questions and share information on the DNA testing.

This is the first year that a descendent of Samuel attended the reunion - from Michigan.

Bud Roseberry, Genealogist, lost his computer and will rebuild the data base that he lost. Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Genealogy Report.

10. Shockeysville Church Report: Scott Luttrell presented the report and stated that the church is financially sound. Work is currently being done on the bell tower. Painting and some repair jobs will be done in the shelter area. Shockey Construction, Virginia, donated \$5,000.00 to the Shockey and Luttrell Memorial Fund. Shockey Construction has donated over \$14,000.00 to the fund since it first started. There is currently a total of \$24,000.00 in the fund. This will be used in the future to pay the minister and do repairs, mow grass, etc., when Scott is physically unable to do these jobs.

If anyone would like to donate, checks can be made to the Shockey Luttrell Memorial Fund.

Discussed the church becoming independent of the mother church. Eleven churches have left the mother church. An 1867 Virginia law states that if a church wanted to leave their parent organization, that organization could not take any of the church's funds. Scott will work with a lawyer in declaring Shockeysville Church a non-profit.

The new name for the Shockeysville Church will be Shockeysville Bible Church. Scott will put four deeds in trusts.

It was suggested that part of the trusts be in the name of Shockey Fellowship Reunion. This would insure the trusts would go to the Shockey Family Memorial Fellowship in the event Scott is unable to continue with this work. Scott will discuss this with David F. Shockey (President) and the Board to see if this should be handled this way.

Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Church Report.

SHOCKEYSVILLE CHURCH REPORT, SCOTT LUTTRELL, Treasurer

Greetings to the Shockeys,

Shockeysville Bible Church is holding it's own during this economic downturn. We have managed to help some groups through this period.

Our members gave \$300.00 to an orphanage in Bolivia. The effort spurred others, a college group of young people and relatives of our member, June Shifflett. The amount grew to more than \$2,000.00.

In October we raised over \$1,500,00 for the Gideons International to purchase and distribute Bibles.

In November we supported Operation Christmas Child (Samaritan's Purse) filling nine shoe boxes with needed items for children.

We have several small fix-up and repair jobs to do on and around the church when warm weather comes. We will be installing a walkway from the gravel parking area up to the church. We have been blessed with an average of sixteen people attending during the bad weather. We have had to miss four or five Sundays due to snow or ice.

THE SHOCKEY AND LUTTRELL MEMORIAL FUND established for the upkeep of the church has grown to over \$30,000.00 due to the generous gifts of Ralph Shockey and J. Donald Shockey of Shockey Construction Company of Winchester, Virginia

I know times are bad, but we need to support each other and those around us who are in need the best that we can. Have a very wonderful reunion in 2009 and beyond. God bless you all.

The orphanage that we collected funds for has 30 or more children who have no parents or relatives to care for them. Their diet consists of bread and milk for breakfast, soup for lunch and milk and crackers for supper. The preacher at a small church nearby, offered to use the money to buy food to supplement their diet such as an egg for breakfast, a hamburger patty for lunch and some fruit for supper. They seldom ever have meat or fresh fruit or vegetables. These children are the innocent victims of life's hard knocks, they deserve better.

The "Shoe Box" program that we participated in was for destitute children up to age 14. We filled boxes with school supplies, personal hygiene items and sometimes some candy or a small toy. None of the above came out of our tithes and offerings to the church.

SHOCKEY Genealogy

It is nearing the end of another winter season and therefore time to start preparing for another edition of the SHOCKEY Family Newsletter and making plans for this years SHOCKEY reunion. Colorado Springs will be a long drive for Naomi and I. Actually I do most, if not all of the driving. Naomi keeps me company until we get in heavy traffic and then she buries herself in a magazine to take her mind off the other vehicles.

There has been several who have contributed new or additional information for the SHOCKEY database. Some of these have been major additions, but large or small, all new additions or corrections to the database is greatly appreciated. I have also received many additional photographs to include in the database. Most were sent by email but I have also received some by postal mail. Either way helps build our family records.

I have not made any additional advances finding the grandparents and great grandparents of John Christopher **Shockey**. The email address that I was using for Rev. Gunter Stopka no longer works and he has removed his email address from his web page.. If we do not get proof any other way, hopefully the SHOCKEY DNA Project will provide the proof on these additional ancestors. This will require the right persons to take part in DNA testing and have their results added to the ever growing DNA databases. Family Tree DNA now has over 147,926 Y-DNA records in their database. That is 32,472 added since I ordered my test one year ago. I still believe these ancestors to be Christians and Elsbeth JAGGI and Hans and Barbli JACOB but did not get the proof.

SHOCKEY DNA Project

The SHOCKEY DNA Project started February 22, 2008 and was set up through Family Tree DNA. Test results have been very informative and quite interesting. One major discovery is that those who carry the bloodlines from John Christopher belong to Haplogroup Q (most likely Q1b subclade) which is quite rare in comparison to other groups. More on this later.

We now have sixteen members in the Shockey
DNA Project. There has been several results that prove
that most of us descend from one common ancestor
within the last six to nine generations but there were
three or four surprises including the discovery of

another surname where the DNA is close to ours but the surname is not.

Most important we have four who have tested and matched perfect 67 out of 67 markers. There is one descendant from Valentine, one from Abraham, one from Isaac and one from Christian Christopher. There is one other who only tested 37 markers but is a perfect match in the first 37 markers to the above four.

There were two who matched 66 out of 67 markers, one a descendant of Abraham and one from John Aaron. There were also two who matched 65 out of 67 markers, one a descendant of John Aaron and on from Isaac. Of these last four, each mutated marker or markers were in unique locations. The results being that even though each only varied from the base standard set above by one or two, between these four the results varied by two to four markers.

Tests for two of the group did not support the paper trail for their ancestors. In each case we believe that we have found the reason for the results.

The surprising surname that appears a close match at 63 markers out of 67 is Baysinger. If there had been only one such occurrence it would have been marked off as a non marital event. However there are two separate cases. The early versions of this surname were Besinger and Boesiger. Both trace their lines back to the 1600s to different ancestors, one in France and one in Switzerland. The second one only tested 25 markers but those 25 match the one from France perfectly. It would appear that somewhere, not too much further back, that we had a common male ancestor.

We also have one new Project member awaiting test results. He has listed his surname as Schockey. The DNA results will let us know if this is a misspelling of **Shockey** or someone not a descendant of John Christopher **Shockey**.

We still have had no one test that is descended from JACOB and SAMUEL. Marie is hopefully that someone in the Pennsylvania area will take the DNA test to help prove Jacob's line. We had a promise from one in Michigan that would have provided the results for Samuel but they have not tested yet. We are also hoping for more descendants of ISAAC to help answer some genealogy questions.

For those who missed this before, the following is a repeat from last year.

The purpose of the SHOCKEY DNA project is to:

- Learn more about our early ancestors and where our ancestors originated.
- assist in identifying descendants of Johann Christoffel SCHACKE, AKA John Christopher SHOCKEY.
- Prove or disprove certain theories regarding some descendant lines that have been questioned.
- Determine if some with variant spellings such as SHAWKEY. SHOCKLEY, SCHOCKEY and others are actually descendants of Johann Christoffel SCHACKE, AKA, John Christopher SHOCKEY.
- Prove the origins of Johann Christoffel SCHACKE and his ancestors and help further our research.
- Prove or disprove the theory that some persons with the SHOCKEY surname are descendants of the SHOCKEY Indian tribe or other Native American group.

The normal cost for the Y-DNA37: 37 Markers
Test is \$259 plus postage. For those who are part of
the Project the cost of the 37 Marker Y-DNA test
\$149 + \$2 postage. The regular cost of the
Y-DNA67 Marker test is \$349 plus postage but as a
part of the project the cost is \$248 + \$2 postage.

When ordering a test kit, you can pay for the test kit by credit card or you can request that they send an invoice with the kit.

The Family Tree DNA test kit consists of two or three sets of cheek scrapers and collection tubes —designed for a single persons use. Each tube contains a fluid designed to arrest bacteria growth, so you can scrape your cheek and return your kit in any type of weather (hot or cold). The freshness of your sample will remain intact for months. Full details of the test kit can be seen on the following page.

DNA Facts

The International Society of Genetic Genealogy list twenty Haplogroups in their 2009 list. Each of these twenty have multiple subclades.

Tests are showing that descendants of John Christopher **Shockey** belong to the Q haplogroup. In human genetics, Haplogroup Q (M242) is a Y-chromosome DNA haplogroup. It is a branch of haplogroup P (M45). It is believed to have arisen in Siberia approximately 15,000 to 20,000 years ago.

This haplogroup contains the patrilineal ancestors of many Siberians, Central Asians, and indigenous peoples of the Americas. Haplogroup Q Y-chromosomes are also found scattered at a low frequency throughout Eurasia. This haplogroup is diverse despite its low frequency among most populations outside of Siberia or the Americas, and at least six primary subclades have been sampled and identified in modern populations.

Scientists have found a a total of sixteen subclades of Haplogroup Q. In the Old World, the Q lineage and its many branches is largely found within a huge triangle defined by Norway in the west, Iran in the south, and Mongolia and northern China in the east. Q is the only Haplogroup common, though now in tiny numbers, to all areas where Pyramids have been built.

Christopher Baysinger and I have had the Deep Clade test to refine our Q type results. Both resulted in the Q1b (M378) subgroup. We need some others who have tested to also do the Deep Clade test to confirm that we all belong to the Q1b group.

There is a descendant of Wolf Shakinovsky; born about 1780 in Lithuania who tested and whose DNA is quite close to the **Shockey** group and is Q1b.

Haplogroup Q1a3a (M3) is the only Y Chromosome haplogroup strictly associated with the indigenous peoples of the Americas. In simple language what this tells us is that even though we do share common ancestors to the Native American Indians, the common ancestor likely lived sometime between 15,000 and 20,000 years ago. Our DNA is very similar to theirs and this may explain some of the "Indian ancestor" stories.
