Dear Friends and Shockey Cousins,

It is time to start planning to attend the 2012 Shockey Reunion. It was great having the reunion in Springfield last year, but I always look forward to having you all back here every other year.

This past year has been rather strange. There have been wild fires, mud slides, floods, hurricanes, lots of tornados and even an earthquake. That was a new and weird experience for me. The weather is all turned around too. People were mowing grass here in town on the last day of December and daffodils were blooming in D.C. The birds and wild things are not sure what to do. Nature will probably get even with us later on.

The 2012 reunion will be held in Virginia on July 5th through 9th. I have reserved rooms at the Hampton Inn in Winchester, Virginia. The address is 1204 Berryville Avenue. The rooms are \$89.00 plus tax. You have a choice of two queen size beds or a king size. If you need a handicap room, you had better reserve early as I don't think they have very many and I have already reserved mine! For reservations, call 540-678-4000 and specify Shockey Reunion. You have until June 15th to get the group rate. Check in time is 3:00 pm. Les will be there all day Thursday to greet you if you arrive before check in time. I will be there on Thursday too, but I am not sure what time. The meeting room is ours until 10:30 pm on Sunday. The Motel offers a free hot breakfast, an outdoor pool and most of the other extras that Hampton Inn usually provides. Directions to the Motel are on another page.

There are a lot of nice places to eat. Shoney's is right across the street and several fast food restaurants are within a few blocks. You can go one more exit south on I-81 to exit 313 or Rt. 50 E and there is a Steakhouse, Cracker Barrel and Golden Corral. Bob Evans, Red Lobster and Olive Garden are a little farther into town. I will try to find a city map for your convenience.

I don't have a complete itinerary, but I do know that on Saturday we offer the tour to Oakland where John Shockey's cabin stands and the Oakland Cemetery. We end the tour at Shockeysville church about lunch time. Scott Luttrell usually provides sandwiches, lemonade and iced tea. He will tell you the history of Shockeysville and the church.

On Sunday we caravan to Shockeysville Church. We will need to leave the motel about 9:00 or a little after as services begin at 10:00. Rev. Isaac Luttrell will bring the message and he and his wife, Diane, play and sing gospel songs which is a wonderful part of the service. Those of you who are here for the first time will be pleasantly surprised. After church we have a picnic lunch and the general meeting. I am not sure which will come first. My sons and grandsons are in charge of the food. I will tell them what the menu should be and where to get it and they are responsible for having the food there on time and serving it. We have done this a few times and it has worked out real well. There is refrigeration available if we need it. The will be \$10.00 per person and children under five are free cost. I do have to have a head count a week or two in advance if possible. You can phone or email the names of those who are with you. You don't need to pay ahead of time. I will collect the money on Friday or Saturday.

On Monday we offer the Maryland/Pennsyllvania Tour. Les conducts this tour and he has more history to add every year as he learns more about the places and the people who lived there. You will see the 1820 acres that belonged to John Christopher Shockey, the spot where Valentine's cabin stood and where Shockey Station stood. I had a picture of Shockey Station and I think Les made a copy of it. This tour takes most of the day. There are several places of interest to visit such as Shank's Mill which was Shockey's Mill at one time. The mill may be open so that you can go inside and see it much like it was more than 100 years ago. Les is an outstanding historian, so I am sure you will enjoy this tour.

I haven't planned anything special for Friday. If I could get enough folks who want a tour of D.C. I would try to charter a Bus for that day. The last time I made this suggestion, only one family responded. Let me know by May 1st if you want to do this. The cost of the charter would be divided equally. If as many as 25 would go, the cost would quite reasonable. Otherwise, you are on your own for that day. There will be brochures in the motel on all of the local attractions. Of course the meeting room will be open and we will be there to visit with you and to add any information you have to the database.

The 2011 reunion was held in Springfield, Illinois and hosted by Grant and Betty Shockey, Clifford and Sally Hill and David and Debbie Hill. They made my job easy. Grant visited all of the motels and sent me information on all of them and a whole stack of brochures on things to do and see in Springfield. Clifford and Sally Hill volunteered to cater the lunch on Sunday and his brother, David and his wife, pitched right in and they did a great job. I want to thank Grant Shockey and the Hill families for all they did to make the reunion one that we will always remember. I didn't do any sight-seeing, but most of the others did. Gwen Rosenfeld took a group on a tour of Elkhart Cemetery where there are many Shockey graves. The Lincoln Museum and the State Museum were enjoyed by all who toured them. There was so much to see that it would have taken several more days to take it all in.

Sunday lunch was in Clayville, Illinois, which is about 16 miles from Springfield. It is an old stagecoach stop and home of the Broadwell Inn which is in the process of being restored. This is where we had lunch. Our hosts had everything fixed so nice and inviting. The food was delicious. Cliff made the baked beans and they were a huge hit! He said I could include the recipe so it is elsewhere in this newsletter.

I wasn't real sure that we would have a good turn out in Springfield, but I was pleasantly surprised. Some of those who did not sign in were Grant Shockey's son and wife and baby and Gwen Rosenfeld's brother. The states represented were Kentucky, West Virginia, Arkansas, Idaho, Ohio, Illinois, Kansas, Oklahoma, California, Missouri, Florida and Georgia.

I really thank all of you for your cards, letters phone calls, articles for the newsletter and donations to help pay the cost. I try to keep the cost down as much as possible, but the cost of mailing goes up almost every year. Last year they told me that if the newsletter had weighed a fraction more, the cost would have been considerably higher. They used to let me have 40 pages, but now I am limited to 36 in order to comply with the weight limit. Last year I printed 1,350 newsletters. I mailed 1,277 and personally delivered as many as I could. The total cost of the bulk mail permit, mailing, and 73 returns @ .50 each was \$2,779.24. Direct donations were \$1,207.00. That left \$1,572.24 out of my pocket until after the reunion. Your dues and proceeds from the sale of t-shirts is all we have to cover that cost. I understand why donations are down. The economy is a mess and folks are struggling just to keep their own bills paid. Some of those who donated regularly for years, have since passed away. We lose some of them every year. We will keep this going as long as we can pay for it. It would not help to put it on line. Too many of those on the mailing list do not do computers. I don't want anyone to be left out. Ralph wanted the newsletter to go to everyone who wanted one. He knew that he would always reach new folks through the others. I know that was not the most practical idea in the world, but look where it has gotten us!

Scott Luttrell usually has some remarks to make regarding Shockeysville Church. He said to tell you that he has repaired the picnic shelters across the road which had been damaged by wind storms and has cleaned up all of the trash that blew in. He is going to paint them as soon as the weather permits. The church is financially doing well. We have been blessed by a mild Winter which has kept the heating cost down and we have only missed two Sundays due to bad road conditions. In the past year we have had several new people attending services pretty regularly. It is still a small congregation which is really good in many ways. We always look forward to having you here for the Shockey reunion.

Several Shockey cousins were able to meet for the first time and some were reunited.

David F. Shockey then opened the meeting and again welcomed all those in attendance. He thanked the Hills for hosting this year's reunion

David L. Shockey, Acting Chaplain, led the opening prayer. He then read the memoriam for those Shockey cousins who had passed on this past year.

Those in attendance introduced themselves and told where they were from. The states represented were West Virginia, Ohio, Kentucky, Idaho, Illinois, Arkansas, Missouri, Oklahoma, Kansas, Georgia, and Florida.

Donna P. Shockey read the minutes of the 2010 meeting. Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the minutes as read.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> David F. Shockey read the Treasurers Report (copy attached) in the absence of Donna Porter. Beginning balance was \$2,829.43. Including the income (dues, church, general fund, and DNA project), the balancewas \$3,935.64. Total expenses were \$1,514.20 (including Newsletter, church, land tax, registration fee, DNA project, 2010 reunion lunch expenses, and bank charges). Balance as of June 2011 is \$2,421.44.

Membership dues and contributions for the Newsletter are down this year.

Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.

Newsletter Report: Marie Shockey presented the Newsletter Report (copy attached). Total expenses for the newsletter were \$2,779.24. Total direct donations were \$1,207.00. Also included in the expense amount is the purchase of 25 T-shirts for \$172.20, bringing the total amount due to Marie for the newsletter and T-shirts is \$1,744.44.

Marie asked that folks keep their addresses current. If there is even a small mistake in the address, the post office will not deliver and it is returned to her at an additional cost. Marie enjoys putting the newsletter together and always welcomes articles that folks send in. Of course all monetary donations are appreciated as this is what keeps the newsletter funded.

Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Newsletter Report and reimburse Marie \$1,744.44.

Genealogy Report: Les Shockey reported that there are well over 20,029 persons in the Shockey data base. There are many photos and can always use additional photos, census records, etc. to be used for verification. Many folks think the Shockeys are German descendants but more are actually Swiss descendants. Found more information on where John Christopher lived in Westmoreland County and discovered that at least one other son besides Samuel Christian lived in or around Westmoreland.

There are 25 participants in the DNA project and all are male descendants from the first 6 sons. No one has been tested for Samuel's line. We have a DNA Fund set up and have received a couple donations. Please contact Les if you would like to participate in the DNA project or if you would like to donate to the fund.

Bud Roseberry continues to work on the data base.

Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Genealogy Report.

<u>Church Report:</u> David F. Shockey read the Church Report in the absence of Scott Luttrell. The endowment fund for the church beginning balance was \$26,827.79 and the ending balance was \$32,943.70. Available for distribution is \$999.90. The church receives weekly donations.

Motion was made, seconded, and approved to accept the Church Report.

Old Business: None

<u>New Business:</u> The 2012 Shockey Reunion will be held in Shockeysville, VA. Typically the reunion is held during the odd years at another location. It was recommended and approved by the board to have the 2013 reunion in Oklahoma City. The 2014 reunion will be held in Shockeysville. We ask that anyone who is interested in hosting a reunion beyond 2014, please let one of the board members know.

Motion was made, seconded, and approved to hold the 2013 reunion in Oklahoma City and to hold the 2012 reunion beginning the Thursday after July 4.

The recommendation has been made to add a new board member. John L. Shockey made a motion to nominate Cliff Hill as the new board member. Motion was seconded and approved to add Cliff Hill as the new board member.

Cliff Hill urged everyone to pay the \$5.00 dues and to consider contributing towards the newsletter expenses. He invited everyone to explore the grounds where the reunion was held. The group picture was made.

The meeting adjourned at 1:45 p.m.

We enjoyed another great reunion this past year, this one in Springfield, IL. There were many new families that were attending the **Shockey** reunion for the first time as well as several cousins that we have come to know and love from past reunions. There were several interesting tours to remember, especially the high speed tour of Springfield that a few of us were given. In the hospitality room Bud and I were again kept busy with updating the database and answering questions. Finding new cousins and adding to and correcting the database makes the reunion worth the effort taking our computer equipment to the reunions worthwhile.

This year the Monday tour on July 9th will again go to Rouzerville, PenMar, Ringgold and visit the actual site of Johann Christoffel (Staphel's) cabin as described in the Journal of Charles Mason and Jeremiah Dixon

I will try to contact Adrain Shank, the son of Yula Shank, again to see if he has completed the restorations to the old mill so that it is again. The bad news to this is that his mother's will is being contested and he is not permitted to allow anyone to tour the property or to start his restoration work until this is resolved.

Again I wish to thank those who have contributed new or additional information for the SHOCKEY database. The family histories and the photographs are always very much appreciated. I continue to add this material as quickly as I can. It is a major help when data is submitted using a genealogy program that conforms to current GEDCOM standards such as RootsMagic 4 or 5. Most programs do conform but Family Tree Maker or Family Tree for Windows do not conform and fail to import data into the proper locations in programs that do meet the standard.

SHOCKEY DNA Project

The **SHOCKEY** DNA Project is part of the Family Tree DNA. Descendants who carry the bloodlines from John Christopher **Shockey** belong to Haplogroup Q (most likely Q1b1a subclade) which is quite rare in comparison to other groups. We now have twenty six members in the **Shockey** DNA Project. I am the only family member to take advantage of the Y-DNA 111 marker test. We do have twenty one who have

tested the Y-DNA 67 marker test. So far only six have had the Deep Clade test which will show the true subclade of Q1b1 or Q1b1a. We have a total of six family members who have taken advantage of the Family Finder test. There has only been one female **Shockey** descendent have the test after so many of the ladies wanted a test that would help prove their **Shockey** lineage. The one who tested does show as a 2nd cousin to one of the males who tested.

We have had one or two person that expressed doubts regarding DNA testing. Marie and I have both been amazed at the accuracy of the results that we have so far. We have used it to verify research and theories. We have also used it to determine which story is true when two families who have common ancestors show different lineages from the ancestor back to Johann Christoffel.

In mid-February I received an email from Dick Shawkey stating that he going to Europe in March and was taking a DNA kit for his friend Wolfgang Schacke who is from Frankfurt but currently works in Switzerland. Dick has since ordered the test kit in Wolfgang's name so hopefully before reunion time we will know if this Schacke line is also part of our family. He plans to also order his own DNA test kit. Later he will see if Fritz Schaake will agree to be tested.

Several have asked for the baked bean recipe served at the Reunion dinner at Clayville on July 3. Here it is.

Note: This recipe is from Paula Deen via her friends, Sue and Gloria, and tweaked a bit by me. It's been called "the BEST Baked Beans EVER!" I would agree.

Serves 12-16 (I calculate 14).

4 16 oz. cans baked beans (64 oz.)

1 20 oz. can crushed pineapple

1/2 c. molasses, optional (only if you like really sweet beans.... I did not use this in the beans served at Clayville)

1 c. barbecue sauce - your favorite brand

2 Tbs. yellow mustard

6 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled (I used a bit more)

1 6 oz. can french-fried onions, crushed

2 -3 tsp. hot sauce, your choice and to taste

2 tsp garlic powder

1/2 tsp black pepper

1 medium chopped green pepper (sautee briefly, or not; I did not. This is part of my "tweak" of the recipe and I think adds to the flavor)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Combine all the ingredients, BUT ADD ONLY HALF THE FRENCH FRIED ONIONS.

Pour into a 9 x 13 sprayed casserole dish.

Sprinkle with the remaining french-fried onions.

The casserole will be very full, so set it on a cookie sheet to save your oven:)

Bake for approximately 1 hour or until it bubbles.

A Move to China

Tonya Shockey Blanchford and her family (Art (husband), Alex (age 11), Sawyer (age 8) and Kayli (age 6) moved to China December 31, 2011. This is their story of the first two months living there.

Getting Used to the Culture is phase 1 of moving to a new country: learning the language, getting around town without being able to drive on your own, and understanding the people (all while trying not to miss home too much)!

We have been here over 2 months now and are still adjusting to everything. It's getting easier every week! Surprisingly, we all like a variety of the Chinese food! Sometimes we get a little picky (okay, a lot!) when it comes to "fish on a stick" at the roadside stands, or choosing a live fish in a tank for dinner! However, we all love dumplings!! So much so, Tonya has taken cooking classes learning how to make them, plus how to cook tofu and other vegetarian dishes.

THE MYSTERIOUS BLUE SHOES

In the early 1930's there was little that people could afford to do for entertainment. The schools put on little programs from time to time and the churches had programs at Christmas, Easter, Children's Day and a home-coming once a year. Everyone attended these functions.

A couple of days before Children's Day, we discovered that my little sister had outgrown her Sunday shoes. This was all day service with dinner on the ground. When all of the recitations were said and the hymns sung, there would be a wonderful dinner. Each family would spread a table cloth or quilt on the ground in the shade of the big Oak trees and there would be fried chicken, ham, potato salad, cole slaw, pickles, home baked bread, cakes pies, iced tea and lemonade. After lunch there would be preaching and singing all afternoon, and someone was going to have to stay at home with my little sister because she had no shoes. We needed a miracle.

On Saturday daddy went to the store to pick up the mail. In the mail was a small package from Montgomery Ward Mail Order Company. We had not ordered anything, so we were curious to see what was inside. It was a little pair of blue t-strap tennis shoes. My parents stared at each other, then mama tried them on my sister. They were a perfect fit!

There was no clue as to who ordered them. No one knew she needed shoes since no one would ever admit that they had to stay at home because one of their children had no shoes. We never learned who ordered them, so to this day the mystery of the little blue shoes has remained just that, a mystery.


Don't forget to pack your Reunion T-Shirts and caps. I will have more there if you forget yours. You need to bring your camera and wear comfortable shoes.


