SHOCKEY Genealogy Updates

Lesley Shockey

Once again I have not had as much time to spend on the **Shockey Family database** as what I would like. There seems to be something to do all the time and it sure takes me longer to accomplish jobs each year. I do add to the data as time permits. It is always a really big help when family show up at annual reunion with their branch of the family prepared and with a GEDCOM to make the import of the data easy. **Having your database well documented will bring big smiles from any genealogist.**

Remember to bring your family photographs that can be scanned and entered into the database. If you do not have a database that can be exported by a GEDCOM, at least be sure to bring additions or corrections to the reunion. Make notes of dates and places in order to insure that we enter the correct information. Too much information is always better than not enough.

We currently have 22,800 names in the master database and 8,146 families. There are 31,000 events listed (births, deaths, marriages and burials and over 1,034 photos of persons or tombstones that are attached to one or more persons. Thank you for all the individuals who submit information to add to the database.

SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT

There is currently 62 individuals who have had their DNA tested are listed on the SHOCKEY-SCHACKE DNA PROJECT. Some members have also taken part in other company DNA tests.

With the Family Tree DNA Project there are 36 individuals who have taken the test for Y-DNA. Five of the members have taken the Big-Y test. I recently upgraded my Big-Y test from 500 to 700 Seven have tested the 111 marker level and another 30 have tested 67 marker. On the Big-Y test I have 40 close matches on this test but the surnames do puzzle me as I cannot see their names as having derived from our Ancestral surnames (SCHACKE, JAGGI, JACKY and the one farthest back of JACOB. I do match the other 4 that have taken the 111 marker test so there is no doubt that I am a descendant of Johann Christoffel.

There are now 24 people who have taken the Family Finder test and almost every day I am notified of one or more of those matching another cousin. Among those who have many matches is Charlotte Shockey with 3,699 matches and Kaylene Silvester with 3,966 matches. I currently have 5,041 matches but there are only a few of those that I can find the genealogy connection. We now have 20 men who have taken the Family Finder test.

Shockey FindAGrave Project

A huge THANK YOU goes out to Stacie George Briggs, Charlotte Shockey, Michelle Shockey, and Stefanie L. Steffey for their wonderful volunteer work on the Shockey FindAGrave Project headed by Charlotte and Stefanie. The Project's mission was to request photos each week (20) of all graves with the surname of Shockey of which there are many whether it's maiden or married. There are still a few remaining to be asked for but Stage 1 of the Project is almost done. While doing this they also have gathered a "issues" list of those who either don't have stones, can't be found, cremated, or unknown. If it's known that there is no stone to be found they put up a photo stating that fact so others will know. Stage 2 will be a spreadsheet of all Shockey's and descendants on FindAGrave. From there it will be compiling a list of Descendants to request photos for. 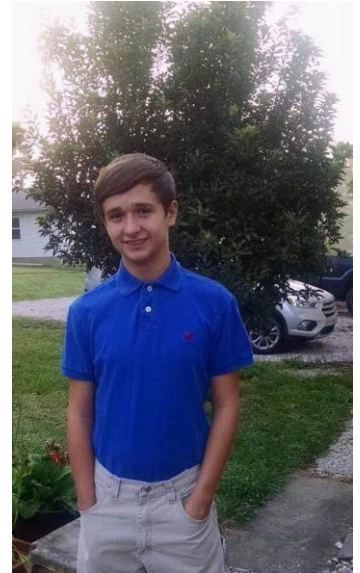

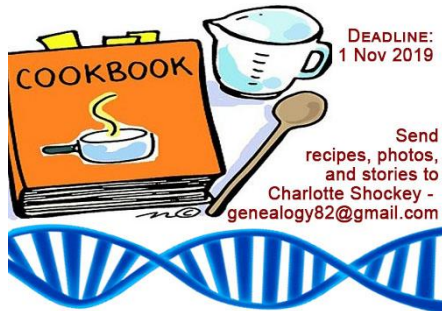

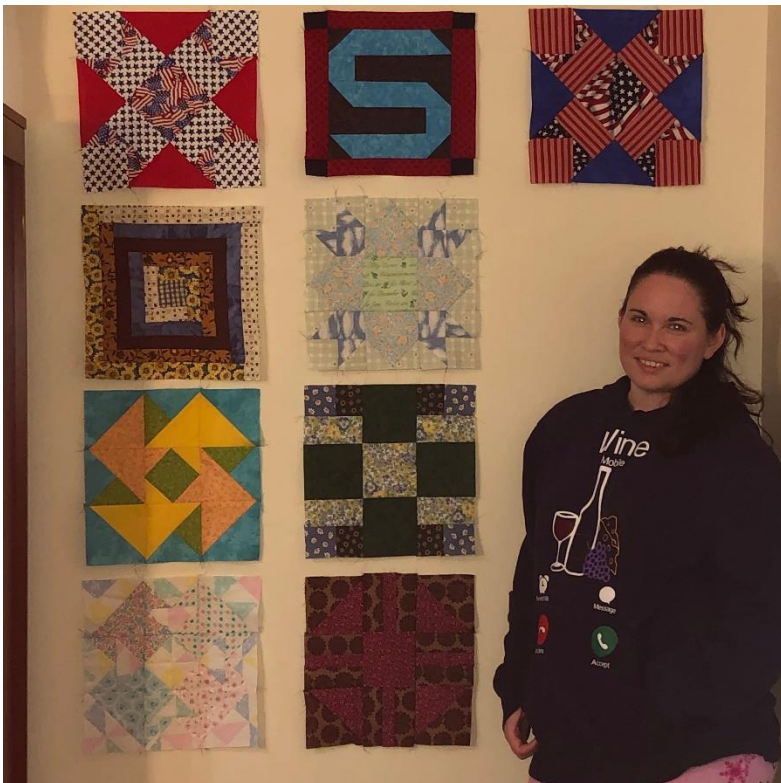
